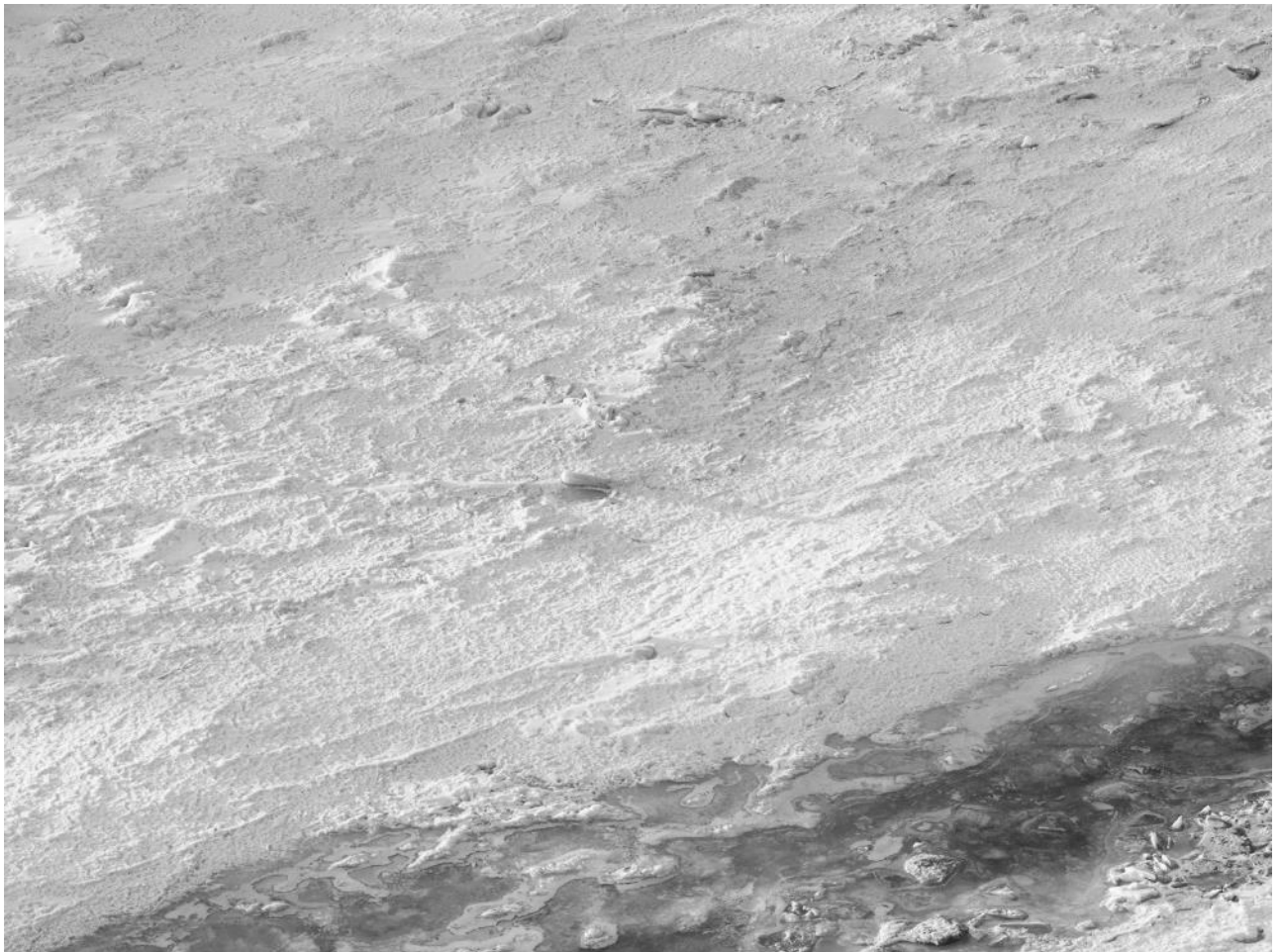


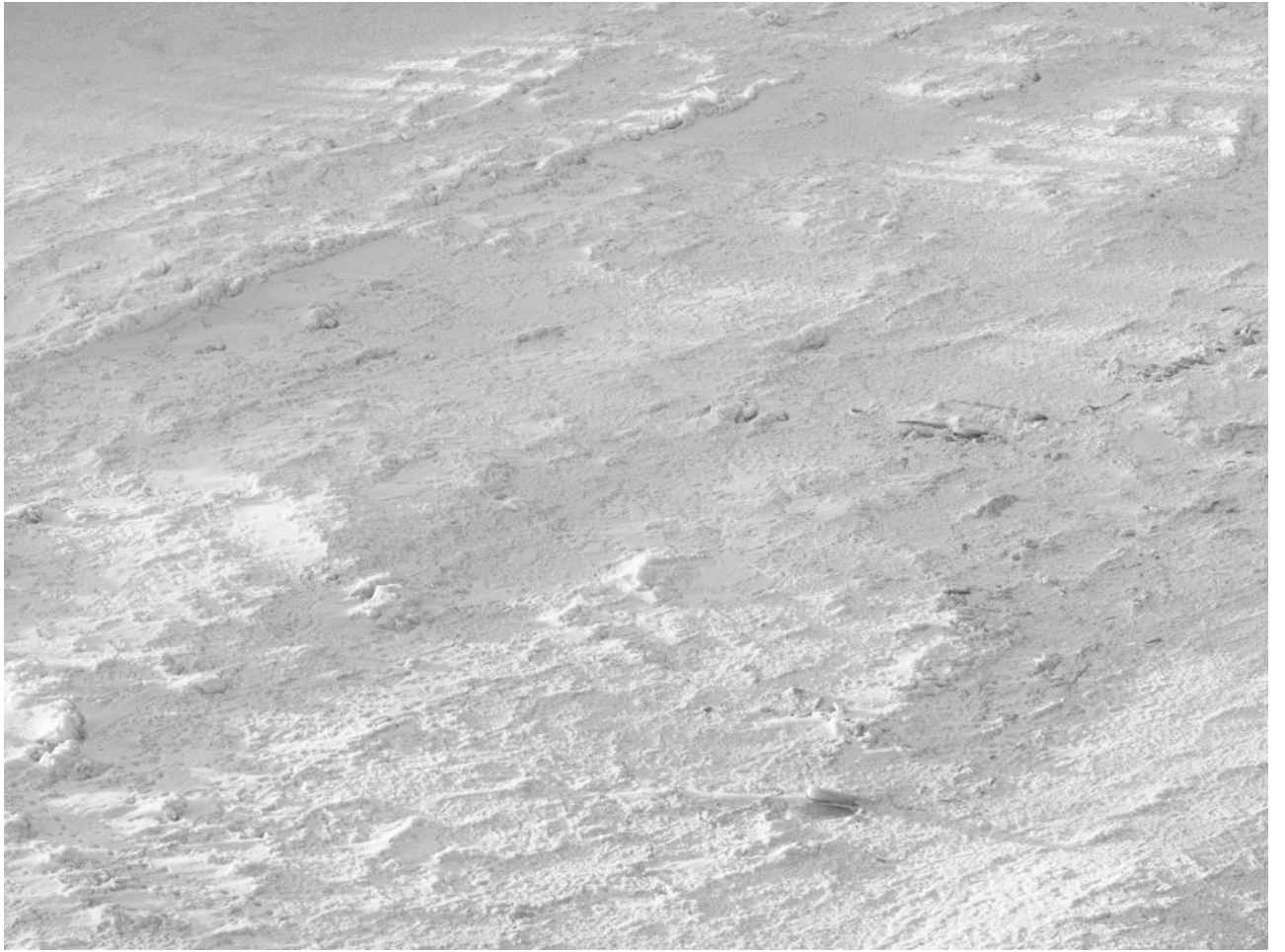
PATHS OF A SORT

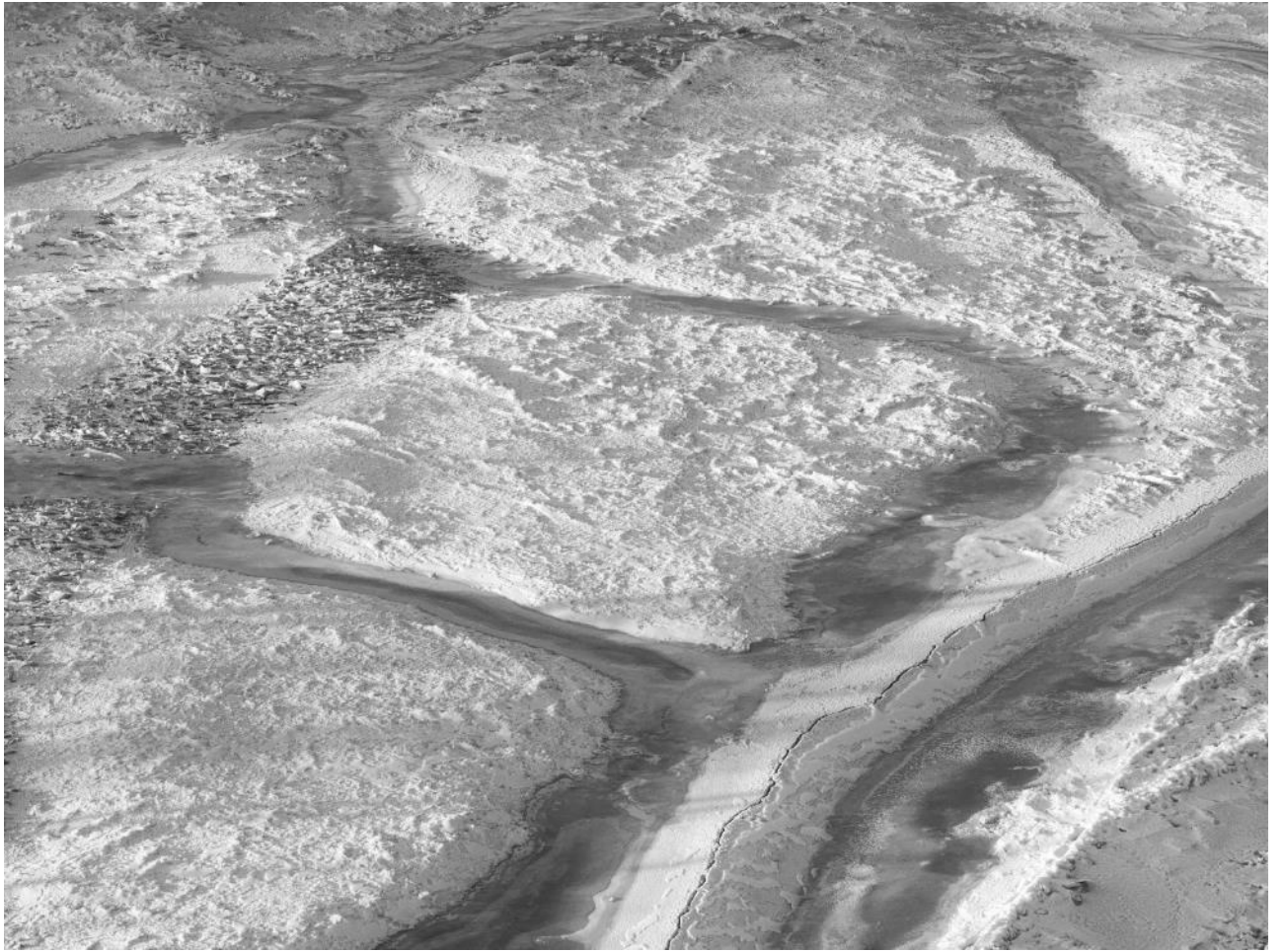
